EQUIPMENT LIST

- **pencil fat enough** (minimum 2B) so that the line does not disappear under the paint.
- fine grain Arches leaves or 300g cloth (I personally use the cloth grain). Allow two quarters of a large sheet per day (approximately 30x40). A block of this size may also be suitable. Provide a few additional "tips" for exercises, as well as classic paper for drawing or a sketchbook (same format as watercolor sheets).
- **plinth tape** to attach the sheet to a board or plexiglass so that it can be tilted
- **old towel** to absorb water damage (and wipe your forehead...)
- **spray:** be careful, it must mist and not project a jet of large drops!
- **several brushes**, You need at least two brushes with water reserves, and one or two more nervous and precise brushes.

As a guide, I use Escoda Aquario brushes for washes: No. 12 or 14, and Escoda Perla for graphics: No. 12.

I also use an angled brush to make indentations (it is necessary that 'it is firm enough to scratch the sheet), and a scriber brush (to draw wrinkles...and other fine graphics)

- **tubes and a palette** large enough to "touch" and add enough pigments. A white porcelain (or glass) plate is perfect

As an indication, my favorite colors are in the Winsor and Newton range:

- *transparent yellow,
- *Indian yellow,
- *permanent pink,
- *Winsor blue with red tendency,
- *Winsor purple,
- *cobalt blue,
- *quinachridone yellow,
- *and alizarin.

More occasionally:

- *ultramarine blue,
- *sienna,
- *light turquoise,
- *scarlet red,
- *shminck orange...
